



Ockanickon Scout Reservation COVID-19 Symptomatic Person/ Positive Test Result Procedure - Revised 5/5/2021

1. Person reports directly to the Health Lodge or, if too sick to be moved, EMS is activated, and person is transported off site for further care.
2. Medical Staff begin screening
  - a. If screening does not indicate that testing and isolation is required, person can resume normal activities once symptoms are no longer present. May continue to rest inside unit's campsite.
  - b. If screening does indicate that testing is required, medical staff will obtain Rapid COVID-19 test.
3. Person will begin isolation until results come back.
  - a. If negative, may return to normal activities as desired once symptoms have disappeared. May continue to rest inside unit's campsite.
  - b. If positive, will remain in isolation until able to leave property for home or further medical treatment if needed.
4. Camp administration will begin contact tracing. All those who had close contact, are asymptomatic and are not vaccinated will need to isolate within the "family unit/cohort"\* until able to be tested. If symptomatic follow steps 1-3. Those who are vaccinated and asymptomatic will be able to continue with normal activities.
5. If person suspected or diagnosed with COVID-19 requires 2 deep leadership to maintain YPT standards, camp staff may step in the help.

\*A "family unit/cohort" is a troop of any size or a group of staff as determined by Camp Administration. It must remain stable without change in membership while at Camp. Scouts, adults and staff cannot be part of more than one family unit/cohort at a time.
