



Ockanickon Scout Reservation COVID-19 Mitigation Plan – Revised 02 JUN 2021

RISK STATEMENT: Ockanickon Scout Reservation strives to provide a safe and meaningful program. As with all programs there is never zero risk. The decision to attend camp should be discussed and decided on by each individual household in the unit. Ockanickon will take every reasonable step to protect our participants and staff. If you decide to come to camp you are accepting that there is a possible risk of exposure to and contraction of COVID-19.

Ockanickon Scout Reservation has implemented multiple Non-Pharmaceutical Interventions (NPIs) to mitigate the risk of potential spread of COVID-19 in camp.

1. All participants and staff will be required to complete a temperature check upon arrival and answer pre-screening questions.
2. Those who have a temperature above 99.9 degrees or who answer yes to screening questions will be asked to leave property.
3. Units and staff will be considered “family units/cohorts”*. When with your “family unit/cohort” masking will not be required.
4. Units should encourage Scouts to partner up and take badges with other scouts in their family unit/cohort.
5. Regular sanitation will be performed in all public/ high traffic areas in camp. Unit areas in the campsite are to be cleaned and sanitized by the unit.
6. Units and staff are encouraged to practice behavioral quarantining** prior to and after their stay at camp.
7. Masking is required as per the published masking policy.
8. Units and Staff will take part in daily temperature and symptom screening.
9. Units and Staff will regularly participate in hand hygiene (soap and water or sanitizer).
10. All meals will take place in the unit’s campsite and for staff in specified program areas.
11. All camp wide programs have either been altered or eliminated to maintain unit and staff safety.
12. Units and staff are encouraged, but **not** required to receive the COVID-19 vaccine at least 2 weeks prior to their stay at OSR.
13. Follow up communication from the Camp Administration will be sent out 3-5 days after your departure from OSR. Unit leaders will be asked to complete a quick questionnaire to confirm no members of the unit have become symptomatic and/or tested positive for COVID-19 since your departure.
14. Units are asked to communicate with Camp Administration if anyone in your unit tests positive or becomes symptomatic for COVID-19 within 10 days after your departure.
15. Camp Administration will handle all contact tracing should the need arise, and contact units and staff as needed.
16. The medical staff will follow the OSR COVID-19 Symptomatic Person/Positive Test Result Procedure should that need arise.



17. Ockanickon strongly discourages visitors at camp and requires advanced notice before such visits occur. We will allow registered leaders to come to camp to perform a Board of Review or Court of Honor. Those Leaders must stay in the unit's site and not visit other areas of camp. This must be pre-approved with Camp Administration during your week. Parents may accompany their Scouts on Sunday during drop-off and Friday during pick up. They are encouraged to drop off and pick up in the parking lot to limit outside visitors to camp but may go directly to the unit's site at the discretion of the unit leadership and may not visit other areas around camp. They must also follow all precautions in place while at camp. If parents need to speak with the Food Service Director or Health Officer this communication should happen prior to the unit's arrival to camp. If directed by either staff member to check in with them on Sunday or Friday parents must first talk to the staff in the campsite to be directed to either location.
18. The Camp Trading Post will operate in a limited capacity to decrease crowding at the trading post.
19. Units are being asked to provide certain items to assist in COVID-19 mitigation in their sites. Please refer to the COVID packing list found on our website under our "COVID FAQs" link.

All mitigation efforts are subject to review by the Camp Director and Council Health Supervisor

*A "family unit/cohort" is a troop of any size or a group of staff as determined by Camp Administration. It must remain stable without change in membership while at Camp. Scouts, adults, and staff cannot be part of more than one family unit/cohort at a time.

**Behavioral quarantine: for 14 days prior to coming to camp and after returning home from camp one should practice physical distancing, mask-wearing when not at home, avoid unnecessary travel, avoid large group gatherings and situations where COVID-19 could be contracted and self-monitor for COVID-19 symptoms.
