Ockanickon Scout Reservation

Who: All Cub Scouts, Webelos, and AOLs*

Fees: \$10.00 per scout (adults are free) if registered by January 14, 2022
\$15.00 per scout if registered after January 14, 2022

**Webelos and AOLs can choose to participate in the Scouts BSA Klondike Derby with a troop or they can participate in the Fun in the Yukon Cub event, but they cannot change between the two once their choice is made.*

Event Headquarters: The event headquarters will be at Palmer B.

Check-In: A roster of all adult vehicles that will be at Ockanickon Scout Reservation must be turned in at the registration table. The roster must list: name, make and model of vehicle, along with license plate number.

Event registration is to be completed by Sunday, January 14, 2022.

Refund Policy: No refunds will be given after January 14, 2022, but substitutions will be permitted. If the Fun in the Yukon is cancelled due to extreme weather or other circumstances, and not rescheduled, all pre-paid registrations will be returned minus a charge for actual costs incurred.

Lost & Found: Any items found should be turned in to the registration table at Palmer B. Items may be claimed during the event or at the February district roundtable.

Check-in will be open from 7:00 to 9:00 AM on Saturday morning. Cubmasters, or designated den leaders, must turn in a roster listing all participants along with leaders' cell phone numbers.

Parking and Vehicles: All vehicles must park in the main parking lot. Please carpool to minimize the number of vehicles.

NO VEHICLES WILL BE ALLOWED TO ACCESS THE CAMP ROADS FROM 11:00PM FRIDAY UNTIL 7:00AM ON SUNDAY. NO EXCEPTIONS WILL BE MADE.

(Note: Webelos and Arrow of Light Scouts are encouraged to participate in the Klondike with their affiliated troop, but they will be able to decide if they want to attend the Cub Event instead. The decision is final, and they will not be able to flip back and forth between events.)

Water: Hydration is essential. Encourage all your Scouts to bring water bottles and drink from them all day long. Water will be available outside of Totem Lodge and Foster Hall.

Campfires: Scouts BSA scouts or adult leaders will start and maintain any campfires that will be used for cooking lunch. Cub Scouts will not be building or lighting fires. No outside wood is allowed to be brought to Ockanickon.

First Aid: In the case of a life-threatening emergency to a Scout or adult, an adult (or Scout if necessary) should immediately call 9-1-1 with a cell phone and then send a runner to Palmer B to report the emergency to the Health Officer. In the case of minor injuries or illness to a Scout or adult, they can use their personal first aid kit or their troop first aid kit; however, there also will be medical personnel at Palmer B. All injuries and illnesses must be reported to your unit adult leader and to the event's medical staff.

COVID Policy: Social distancing, frequent hand washing, and masks are recommended. Masks are required when anyone is inside Palmer B or in any other building. Those experiencing illness should stay home and not attend the event. **This information is subject to change, based on updates to COVID guidelines from Washington Crossing Council at the time of the event.**

Sanitation: Secure all food and/or trash around your campsite. Trash can be placed in the camp's dumpster, unless directed otherwise.

12:00 PM – Stations close until after lunch

Cub Scouts will prepare their hot lunch on the side of the roadway between Dan Beard and Seneca. Adult leaders (or Scouts BSA Scouts who offer to assist) will start and maintain any campfires that will be used for cooking lunch. Cub Scouts will not be building or lighting fires. No outside wood is allowed to be brought to Ockanickon.

1:00 PM – Stations reopen for afternoon

3:30 PM – All stations will CLOSE

4:00 PM – Station Managers and Dens must return the score sheets to the registration table in Palmer B

Event Specific Rules

Group Size – Please try to limit the Den size to a maximum of 6 to 8 Scouts

Uniform – No Field Uniforms (also known as Class A Scout uniforms) are required for the event. Scouts must dress appropriately for the anticipated weather conditions and **must wear boots or hiking shoes.** (NO SNEAKERS) Clothing must contain no inappropriate language or graphics. Dress in layers so you can adjust your comfort level. **NO SHORTS.**

Station Volunteers – **Each unit is asked to run one station per group registered from their unit.** Station managers are asked to register their choice(s) of stations to run in advance of the event. After submitting their station choices to either Nina Marino Ninab1121@gmail.com or N. Sonnie smtroop168@gmail.com, they will be provided with information on what the unit will need to bring in order to successfully run their chosen stations. If a Pack simply does not have the adult resources to run a station, please discuss this issue with the event coordinator ahead of time.

What Cub Scouts Need to Bring to the Event

Scout Spirit is essential to any Scouting event. Be prepared to have a lot of fun and learn new skills.

Each Cub is required to have a day pack which they must carry. It is not the responsibility of the leader or parents to carry the pack.

The Day Pack must include:

- First Aid Kit
- One quart of water per Scout and a safe way to drink it
- A trash bag to collect garbage found on the trail
- Snack
- Pencil or Pen and a Notepad
- At least one watch
- A mirror or other reflective signaling device
- A compass
- Any Cub Scout Handbook
- A method to mark and measure distance
- Supplies needed for lunch
- Den are encouraged to have Den Flag and a Den Cheer.

Any other supplies needed to participate in the events will be provided at the stations (such as rope, staves, trifold bandages, etc.).
