

Welcome to Shoots, Ladders, and Paddles 2. We have an action-packed weekend planned for you and your scouts.

Program

We will have use of the 'lake', climbing tower and the rifle range. At the range we will use muzzle loading rifles for half of the day and .22 pistols the other half. Weather will determine which goes first.

Ockanickon's gaga pit and volleyball court will be available.

Cost

\$35 per camper, \$25 per over 21 adult, if you register by August 31st. After Sept. 1st till Sept. 12th, registration increases to \$45 per camper and \$30 per over 21 adult. Shirts are available for purchase. They will be purple with the venturing logo on the front and the shots, ladders and paddles design on the back. The designs and print will be white. Shirts must be pre ordered and paid for by August 22nd.

Check in Procedures

The adult and youth leader will need to check in at the Manny Marks pavilion next to the parking lot at Ockanickon Scout Reservation, OSR. Please have a roster of all youth and adults who will be camping with you. Also indicate on our roster those who have recently, within the last year, passed the BSA swimmer's test. Also have the make, model and license number of the vehicles that will be parked at camp. One vehicle will be allowed to transport your unit's gear to your campsite. If you have a trailer, the trailer may be left at your site. All vehicles must be parked in the parking lot. **No vehicles are allowed in camp.** Your unit will be escorted to your campsite. Check in begins at 6pm.

The Scout oath and the Scout Law are the rules to follow at camp. No smoking is allowed where youth, under 21, are present. There are 2 designated smoking areas in camp. The first area is behind Foster Hall and the other is behind Totem Lodge. No alcoholic beverages, illegal or non-prescription medication, firearms, fireworks are permitted in camp. Possession may result in dismissal from the event.

Those who exhibit covid symptoms will be isolated.

Anyone who feels unsafe or has thoughts they might not be safe attending because of Covid 19 should consider not attending

Anyone considered “high risk” should consider not attending. Units should provide hand sanitizer and a hand washing station with soap in their campsites.

We ask that all participants use the “buddy system” when moving through the camp.

Camping Requirements

- 1) Be current chartered members of the BSA.
- 2) Adult campers must have current youth protection training (YPT 2.0).
- 3) PA state law requires all adults who are PA residents must complete the required PA state clearances – **no exceptions.**
- 4) Adults should complete Hazardous Weather Training which can be found at my.scouting.org.
- 5) Each unit must have 2 fully trained adult leaders. Units with female under 21, must have at least 1 female adult leader.
- 6) Unit leaders must have in their possession a signed annual health and medical record (AHMR), parts A and B only. A photocopy of each individuals health insurance card should also be obtained.
- 7) You will be sharing campsites with other units. Campsites will have tent platforms and 3 sided Adirondacks, which can sleep up to 6. You must provide your own tent. There is a latrine in each campsite. The welcome center will be open all weekend for participants. Flush toilets and showers will be available. Please do not trash the latrines or the welcome center.
- 8) The water in the campsites will be turned off. Water is available on the side of Foster Hall and Totem Lodge. It is suggested to bring a wagon to help transport water containers.
- 9) If your unit is going to have a campfire, it must be in the available fire circles.

We ask that units bring a snack for Saturday night’s cracker barrel and fellowship. Bring a game that you would like to share with other campers.
